Hatch Amendment (SA 1428) to S. 1298 / H.R. 2892 (DHS Appropriations)

Background: “For hundreds of unlucky immigrants, the death of a wife or husband has been quickly followed by an order to leave the country. It’s called the “widow penalty,” a tragic quirk in federal law that unfairly punishes recently married immigrants whose citizen spouses die before their green-card paperwork is processed.” – *New York Times Editorial, April 28, 2009.*

Need for Legislation: The pace of immigration adjudication and the happenstance of death should not control the fate of law abiding immigrants who marry Americans in good faith. A change in law is needed to allow for a case-by-case adjudication of the validity of the marriage instead of the automatic denial policy currently in place. SA 1428 Sponsors: Hatch (R-UT), Nelson (D-FL), Cornyn (R-TX), Menendez (D-NJ), Bennett (R-UT), Reid (D-NV), Schumer (D-NY), Kennedy (D-MA), and Gillibrand (D-NY)

How are Marylanders Affected? Maryland widow Mrs. Maria Paula Robledo, and her son Mateo Pinzon have joined with another Maryland widow Mrs. Zainab Hassan-Norris, to challenge the widow penalty in Maryland. The case is Robledo v. The legislation is also supported by a bi-partisan group of 32 Congresspersons who co-sponsored H.R. 1870 (SA 1428 was based on this) including McGovern (D-MA), Bilbray (R-CA), Grijalva (D-TX), Lungren (R-TX), Garrett (R-NJ), Pastor (D-AZ), Wolf (R-VA), and many others.

How can Senator Mikulski Help?: Senator Mikulski can support the Hatch Amendment (SA 1428) by insisting that it be included in the House version during Conference Committee on the DHS Appropriations Bill (S.1298/H.R.2892), and ensuring its safe passage into the final version.
